 - 2. He is King of an eternal and righteous Kingdom (ls.9:7; Dan.7:14)
 - 3. An OT picture of the "Son of Man" on His glorious throne (ls.6:1-5; Jn.12:38-41)
- 3. The coming of the Son of Man (25:31)

- 1. The Second coming of the Son of Man is repeatedly mentioned in Scripture (Matt:24:3,37; 25:31; 26:64)
- 2. The magnitude of the Second Coming of the Son of Man
 - 1. Jesus the Creator is coming again
 - 2. Miraculously, the nations of the world will be gathered before Him (Matt.25:32a)
 - 3. The gathering of the nations will witness a miraculous, and final dividing of humanity (Matt.25:32b,32)
 - 4. The dividing of the people will be fixed forever (Matt.25:34,41,46; Lk.16:19-31)
- 4. The "Son of Man" will come as Saviour and Judge (Matt.25:34-46)
 - 1. The OT prediction of the Son of Man as Judge (ls.11:3-5)
 - 1. The context of this prophecy is the Messiah's work (11:1-5)
 - 2. His divine attributes
 - 1. His innate omniscience needed to judge (Perfect knowledge of all things) (11:3)
 - 2. His sovereign power to judge all without exception (11:4b)
 - 3. His three-fold holiness with which to judge (ls.11:5; 6:3)
 - 2. Jesus: The criteria used in the ultimate judgment (25:35-36,42-43)
 - 1. Question (25:35-36)
 - 2. The consistent message of the Bible: Good works cannot earn salvation, but good works are the necessary result of salvation
 - 1. Salvation is not earned through good works (Gal.2:16)
 - 2. Good works are the necessary result of salvation (Matt.7:16-20; Jms.2:17)
 - 3. The fruit of the Spirit (Gal.5:22-23; 1Cor.13)
